

Pet Emergency Kit: Small Animals

Store items in a sturdy, waterproof container so they can be carried easily and keep in an accessible location

Food & Water

- Two week supply of food, water and treats
 - For frozen/refrigerated food, place in a cooler with ice packs
- Manual can opener and spoon for canned food if needed
- Airtight container (for pellets)
- Food & water bowls/attachable water bottle

Note: Keep note of expiration dates of food and treats and rotate out as necessary.

Rotate out water every 6 months to maintain freshness.

Medication

- Copy of medication and/or specialty food prescription(s)
- A month's worth of extra medication, vitamins, supplements, flea and tick treatments, etc.
- All necessary supplies (pill gun, syringes/needles, pill cutter, etc.)
- Cooler and chemical ice packs for medication requiring refrigeration
- Sturdy plastic container to safely dispose of syringes/needles

Note: Rotate out all vitamins/supplements regularly to maintain freshness. Keep all medications in a waterproof container and replace before they expire.

First Aid Kit

- Small Animal first aid reference book
- Critical Care powdered formula
- Supplements for digestive support
- Cotton bandage rolls, pads & swabs
- Bandage tape
- Antibiotic ointment & antibacterial spray
- Latex gloves

- Saline solution
- Disinfectant solution/hydrogen peroxide
- Blunt scissors & tweezers
- Styptic powder or corn starch
- Syringes & eye dropper
- Digital thermometer & petroleum jelly (lubricant)
- Instant cold packs & heating pad

Note: Replace all items after each use and update twice a year.

Include veterinarian, emergency veterinarian and poison control contact information.

Waste & Sanitation Supplies

- Litter pan, litter/bedding & scooper
- Paper towels
- Plastic bags & trash bags
- Liquid dish soap

- Hand sanitizer
- Disinfectant
- Disposable gloves
- Unscented baby wipes

Safety Supplies

- Carrier/crate
- Blanket or sheet to cover carrier/crate
- Sturdy gloves
- Large towel
- Nail clippers

Comfort Supplies

- Familiar toys
- Blanket & bedding
- Grooming supplies
- Appropriate exercise equipment

- Chewing items (wood chews)
- Hideaway
- Heat source (heating pad with extension cord)
- Clothing with your scent

Important Paperwork: Identification

- Registration information, adoption papers, proof of purchase
- Current photo of pet and photo of you with your pet
- Description: species, breed, age, gender, sex, color(s), and any distinguishing characteristics
- Owner and emergency contact information
- Microchip number

Note: Keep all documents in a waterproof container

Important Paperwork: Boarding Instructions

- Feeding schedules, medications and administration, allergies, behavioral problems, handling and any special notes
- Pet insurance policy information
- · Copies of vaccination records, medical records, and rabies certificate

Note: Keep all documents in a waterproof container
